

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### **GETTING TO KNOW YOU**

As we reboot the Gondalier what better way to start the "Getting to Know You" feature than with Anita Wood, who is our longest year-round resident. Anita has lived at 2076 Ca'D'Oro since Feb-ruary of 1982. As a single

woman with a penchant for travel, Anita emigrated from Germany in 1970 and lived on both US coasts as well as in the north and south. With her myriad of job experiences throughout America, including translation work, Anita settled on Sarasota to make her permanent home. She purchased her then-9-year-old home for \$25,000 at a no-age limit, non-resident-owned VPE. The park became resident owned in 1986, and during those years Anita recalls jumping right in and helping with mowing, painting homes inside and out, decorating, caring for snowbirds' homes, and gardening.

Interestingly, Anita recalls the landscape in the early 1980s surrounding VPE as all woods, no shopping centers (no Publix!), no traffic, and 41 was an easily transversed two-lane road. She reminisced over empty beaches, especially enjoying Turtle Beach. As the years passed Palmer Ranch first began developing behind Chez Vous and has exploded ever since. Because of the qui-et woodsy environment, all shopping and errands were done on Clark Road.

Singleness suited Anita well for many years, but as love would have it, while waitressing at the counter at M&D restaurant (now Max's Table in Osprey), a patron named Ben, whom she chided for his stingy

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tipping, stole her heart and they were married in 1990 until his passing in 2017. Anita's work ethic continued to drive her as she served patrons for over 14 years at Dutch Valley Restaurant.

Approaching 40 years at the park, Anita has always felt safe and never feels alone even though she lives alone. She finds VPE to be a big family with lots of good times here including activities like "carry-ins," a bowling league in the past, and playing cards all along.

Be sure to stroll up to Anita and her 15 1/2-year-old pup Bella as they walk our streets and enjoy her accent, and even more, her glowing memories as our unofficial "park historian."

To all our returning Hackers and Smackers and new members interested in golfing. VPE members and their guests will be golfing at a par 3 golf course every Tuesday starting in January until the end of March.

### **Tuesday starting January 4, 2022.**

There are 2 ways to join:

- 1. Ladies golf new for 2022. Few ladies have joined our group in the past, so I'm suggesting that we try to get a group of ladies who would like to golf together every Tuesday starting in January. If there is not enough for a ladies group, I would ask you if you were interested in joining the regular group (#2).
- 2. Tuesday golfers. VPE men and women who would like to golf at our par 3 course together on Tuesday's starting January 4, 2022.

Golfers from above should sign up at the clubhouse so that we have an idea of how many tee-off times we need at the golf course.

To those who would like to continue on and play 18 holes the total cost is \$24 walk/ \$36 ride.

The first tee time this year at Village Green is at 9:42 am.

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### A BRIEF HISTORY OF VENETIAN PARK ESTATES:

Founded in 1970, converted to resident owned June 15,1988\*

In 1970, Sam and Doris Cutler and Doris' brother Karl Bigelow, were looking for possible land investment opportunities. While driving north on Tamiami Trail, they discovered a great piece of land, perfect for a mobile home park. It was located adjacent to the Trail and Catfish Creek. Upon further investigation, they decided to buy the land from a Mrs. Giordano. They cleared the land and divided it into 197 lots suitable for the intended park. Thus began the development of what we now know as Venetian Park Estates. The owners paved the streets, built the clubhouse, swimming pool and shuffleboard courts. Mary Ellen Bigelow, Karl's wife, named the streets---Venetian Drive, Ca'D'Oro Drive, Chez Vous Drive, Gondola Drive, Piazza Drive, Palazza Drive. Venetian Park was established and ready for operation. The monthly rental fees at that time were \$45.00 & \$55.00 per month depending on the location. The residents rented the land for their coaches, which they individually owned. Betty Eichelberger, Frances Lewkowski, Lucy Poole and Cecil & Ida Mae Rodgers were some of the first residents.
