Their efforts were successful and on February 1,1988 the Articles of Incorporation were originally filed with the State of Florida. The park was purchased on June 15,1988 for \$4,150,000.00.

A down payment of \$1,100,000.00 was made through subscription shares. The loan balance of \$3,050,000.00 remained and was paid over the remaining 15 years. On October 5, 1988,

Venetian Park Estates, a resident owned park was incorporated. The final mortgage payment was made on September 24, 2003.* To be continued...

A BRIEF HISTORY OF VENETIAN PARK ESTATES (CONTINUED):

Once the committee was formed and resident members became the first officers of the new organization, all the residents of the park were invited to join the organization with dues of \$5.00 per coach. A legal fund of \$100.00 per coach was established. This money was part of the earnest money needed to accompany the offer to purchase the park. Upon completion of the purchase, this money was returned to the subscribers.

Because of the "unconscionable" rent increases and "unreasonable" rules imposed by the Michigan owners, a negotiating committee was formed to represent the members of the park in dealing with management. The negotiating committee members were: Delton Powell, Robert Watt,

Clarence "Red" Crider, Angela Tiedge and Marie Nelson.

This committee successfully won concessions from management at one mediation meeting at the state level and was prepared to meet with the owners of the park the very day that the Michigan

group agreed to sell the park. Chairman Delton Powell, the officers and board members worked diligently with the attorneys in the efforts of the residents to purchase the park. Some of the people who went door to door to obtain the cooperation of their fellow residents were: Jim Andrews, Doris



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

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
