This might be the best tuna sandwich ever. It is not an ordinary tuna melt. Don't be afraid of the kalamata olives and capers.

They really make the sandwich. Instead of the French bread you can substitute English muffins or

any dense bread. You will be sad when these are gone!

Kicked Up Tuna Melts

2 (6 oz.) cans solid white tuna, drained

1/3 C. kalamata olives, pitted and minced

^I 1 T. capers, drained

¹ ¼ C. red onion, finely chopped

1¹/₂ T. fresh lemon juice

I ¹/₂ T. freshly ground black pepper

I 6 T. mayonnaise (or more if preferred)

8 slices tomato

8 thin slices provolone cheese

1 baguette French bread, approx. 8-9 in. long

Combine the tuna, olives, capers, onion, lemon juice, pepper, and mayo. Slice the bread lengthwise. Spread the tuna mixture evenly onto both sides of the bread. Top with lightly salted tomato slices and then provolone cheese. Bake on a cookie sheet at 350 degrees until the cheese is melted and starting to brown. Carefully slice into serving size pieces.

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


