GETTING TO KNOW YOU

Our VPE office manager, Tony Turlenko, was born in 1947 in post-war Europe. His parents, Wesily and Polina, met at a displaced persons camp in Korbach, Germany after World War II, and that is where Tony was born. Wesily was

from Mariupol, Ukraine and Polina from Odessa, Ukraine. They were taken separately by the Nazis for slave labor during World War II where the Nazis benefited from Wesily's basic skills in plumbing and electrical, and Polina worked in a labor camp as a cook; she spoke to Tony of a good meal as leftover boiled potato skins. Beyond that, his parents didn't speak much about what happened during the war, understandably.

When Tony was five the Turlenkos were sponsored to come to America by a New Jersey chicken farmer. His parents worked the farm and were paid \$5 plus room/board. On Sundays the rancher drove them to the Russian Orthodox church as there was not a Ukrainian church, but fortunately, the Turlenkos spoke Russian in addition to Ukrainian as well as Polish, Yiddish, and German. They attended the Russian church regularly and were enlightened by fellow worshipers that they were being grossly underpaid at the farm. The kindhearted fellow immigrants hatched a plan for them to leave the ranch and travel to Cohoes, New York, in Albany county, where a man would meet them and help them on their way to better jobs. Funds were collected by the church members and after being dropped off one Sunday to church as usual by the rancher they then left on a Greyhound bus and traveled to New York state. When they arrived they indeed were met by a man who set them up in a refugee ghetto. Tony was an only child and was a latchkey kid as his father worked in plumbing and construction, and his mother in textiles. Cohoes, New York was known as "spindle city" and his mom wrapped thread on bobbins. When Tony was 13 his parents became naturalized American citizens and chose not to change either their first or last name but they changed Tony's first name to Antole from Anthony, of which he would have preferred

remaining Anthony from a fitting-in standpoint in school! Interestingly, Tony relayed that any name that ends in the letters e-n-k-o is Ukrainian in origin. Tony himself speaks Ukrainian and Russian.

In time, the family moved to Rochester, New York, where Tony's father was the head steamfitter for Bond Clothes, a large clothier in the Rochester and Buffalo areas. After finishing high school in Rochester Tony attended Syracuse University. However, in his third year, with the Vietnam war raging and having a low draft number, Tony enlisted in the Navy. He was assigned to a fighter squadron VF-111 out of Miramar, California, and served on the aircraft carriers USS Ticonderoga and USS Shangri-la in the South China Sea for two years. He worked for a time on the flight deck where he suffered hearing loss from the fighter jets, and then as a yeoman, one who takes care of the officers. He then had shore duty at the Nuclear Power Training Unit in Ballston Spa, NY. Another detail he was assigned, due to Tony's ability to speak Russian, was a military limo driver where he would pick up, among others, Russian naval officers in New York. On one occasion after being spoken to in Russian by Tony, the Russian passenger spoke English back, inquired of Tony's name, and once Tony replied Turlenko, the passenger spoke to him in Ukrainian, knowing the origin of Turlenko. Tony's father Wesily was none too pleased that Tony was assigned with transportation for the enemy Russians. Tony completed his four years of service as a yeoman second class. Tony and Judy Turlenko

After Vietnam, Tony was able to finish his degree at Syracuse University with a BS in marketing. Upon graduation, he worked for the Georgia-Pacific

Company in the mid 1970s in the building materials division, first in Miami and then was transferred to Binghamton, New York. One hot summer day while building a TV stand in his apartment out of his plenteous scrap lumber he propped the door open for fresh air. A precocious 5-year-old boy named Douglas peeked in and began to pepper Tony with questions as to what he was making. Tony

invited the boy to assist. Loquacious and curious, matchmaker Douglas inquired if Tony was married and Tony replied that he was not married. The boy replied, "neither is my mom!" Thus, he met Judy, who became his wife in 1976 when Tony was 30 and is now a stepfather to Douglas and his brother. Tony's mother Polina succumbed to cancer when Tony was newly married. After her death Tony's father Wesily felt compelled to tell him something about his mother that was kept a secret. explained that Polina was not actually Ukrainian but Polish, and in order for Wesily and Polina to remain together in the displaced persons camp, she made the bold decision to say she was Ukrainian like Wesily; a secret she kept her whole life but which also kept their family together.

Tony's career transitioned to becoming a franchise lumber company owner/manager with Seals Lumber from 1975-2000, eventually expanding to eight locations in the east/southeast. Business was going well until the "big box" stores joined the fray and several of Tony and his partner's locations had to close. Sadly, Tony's partner committed suicide at which time Tony and Judy moved to Florida with five stores remaining. With the proliferation of Home Depot and Lowe's, Tony sold his lumber stores back to the franchise and purchased a print shop in Venice in 2001-2018 called Professional Printing and Graphic Design.

After selling his print shop, Tony saw an advertisement for the officer manager position here at VPE on Indeed and has been serving us faithfully and quietly ever since. He enjoys fishing and reading. He also visits the North Port Ukrainian church baked good sale every spring for their orthodox Easter goodies where Tony buys the paska, an Easter bread, just like his mom made.

Dyakuyu (thank you in Ukrainian) to Tony for sharing his heroic and resilient life story with the VPE family. Remarkably, what Tony enjoys the most about his job here is getting to know the residents and hearing their interesting stories. Ironically, Tony's is an incredible one.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Avocado caprese salad is a perfect thing to take to a 4th of July picnic or any backyard barbecue. It is light and refreshing and super easy to make.

Avocado Caprese Salad

- 1 pint red cherry or grape tomatoes, halved
- 1 pint yellow cherry or grape tomatoes, halved
- 2 large avocados, peeled and cut into small cubes
- 8 oz. mini fresh mozzarella balls
- ½ cup fresh basil, chiffonaded
- 3T. honey
- 3T. white balsamic vinegar (use only white)
- 3T. extra virgin olive oil
- 1/4 t. salt
- ¼ t. pepper



In a large bowl toss together the tomatoes, mozzarella balls, avocados and basil. In another small bowl heat the honey in a microwave for 15-20 seconds, just enough

to thin it out. Then whisk the honey together with the olive oil and balsamic vinegar and salt and pepper. Pour dressing over the salad and toss gently.
