



HONOR FLIGHT

Paula: To say that our experience on the Honor Flight was amazing is nothing short of an understatement. From our arrival at the St. Pete airport September 20 at 4 in the morning, to the moment we walked down the airport corridor at 8:30 that evening to greetings by a welcome home committee, it was the stuff of magic. Our flight had 72 veterans, 72 guardians and 20 support staff. While waiting to board the plane it occurred to me that the level of respect that was shown to these veterans was off the charts. As we were waiting, a WWII vet played each of the service hymns on the harmonica; he was great.

We flew into Baltimore and boarded a bus to Washington, DC. Our Washington tour began with a stop at the Air Force Monument, its three tall spires represent the USAF Thunder Birds "bomb burst" maneuver. It was simply outstanding and awe inspiring. We stopped briefly at the Iwo Jima Memorial and the marines on the bus gave a proud cheer. Our next stop was at the Lincoln Memorial, Korean Memorial, and Vietnam Wall complex.

At the Korean Memorial, upon seeing the first statue in The Column, we were struck by the feeling that the soldier was looking right at us; such was the feeling when seeing each of the 19 men depicting a platoon on a dawn patrol. Nearly 37,000 names are engraved on the granite wall honoring the men and women that were killed in the Korean War.

It was a short walk to the Vietnam Wall. The names of 58,320 dead, missing, or prisoners are listed in chronological order from 1965 to 1975. I was able to see the name of Captain John H. Crews III, the name on the POW bracelet I wore from 1971 to 1975. Seeing John's name among the thousands brought home to me the enormity of the cost that so many dearly paid with their lives.

The final stop of our tour was the World War II Memorial. We were met by a bagpipe player in full regalia. My dad held a Navy banner for a very special picture with the piper. The piper played a mournful tune as we walked around the pillars of the states. My dad stood proudly in front of the Indiana

pillar. There are 4,048 gold stars representing the deaths of over 4,000 Americans who lost their lives in WWII.

We boarded the bus to the airport and talked about all that we had seen in the past few hours; it was a whirlwind. My dad said, "it really gives me hope for our country and its future," and I feel the same way. It was such a privilege and an honor to share this experience with my dad. God Bless America!

Jerry: Paula's article gives you an idea of what the Honor Flight program is all about. We could write volumes about our day but had to do a condensed version. From morning to night we were treated with honor and respect. If you want to know more just ask and we will be happy to tell you about it. The Honor Flight program is amazing and the experience gives those who attend a new outlook on life. I would recommend any veteran or his/her family to look into this. It's a once in a lifetime experience.

Note: Jerry Ralston served in the US Navy, aboard a destroyer from 1952-1956, during the Korean War. He and his wife, Ruby have lived here for 16 years. They are originally from Indiana. Their daughter, Paula, also lives in VPE.

Have you heard of the Honor Flight program? They fly groups of veterans to Wash. DC for a day trip. They get a military send-off from here, and get military greeting when they arrive. They have a day of touring the war memorials and Arlington National Cemetery. It is offered to Veterans at no charge. They do have to have an escort who pays his/her expenses. It was originally offered to WW2 vets, but is now open for Korean & Vietnam Veterans.

HURRICANE IAN

SEPTEMBER 28, 2022 3:05 PM CATEGORY 4 150 MPH

On Wednesday, September 28, 2022, VPE was in the path of a once in a century hurricane.

Landfall was at Cayo Key Island, near Sanibel and Captiva Islands at approximately 3:30 PM.

I was hunkered down in Venice, FL. The winds at the western or northern eye wall of the hurricane were in excess of 150 MPH. The winds at VPE were only slightly less, perhaps 100-120 MPH.

On Thursday morning, I left Venice at 7:00 AM to return to VPE. The roads were strewn with storm debris. None of the traffic signals were working. Each intersection needed to be observed as a four way stop. I arrived at VPE at 7:25 AM

The Park roads were littered with all sorts of debris, and some were blocked by downed trees. I walked up and down the streets meeting with people, asking how they were and assessing the damage. Bill Milsop, our Maintenance Manager, was already on the job cutting tree limbs and clearing the roadways. By 10:00 AM, with the exception of the roadway in front of Tina Pontoni's and Manny Lejuene's homes on Ca'd'Oro Drive, both lanes of all the roadways were passable. In that case, Katy and Brian Strand's roof was ripped off and landed on Ca'd'Oro Drive.

At this time, I discovered that our sewer plant (specifically the lift station pump) wasn't working because we lost our electricity. So, Bill and I went to examine the lift station. We lifted the cover and found that it was filled to the top. Any additional inflow into the lift station would result in an overflow and spillage onto our grounds. So, we turned the water off.

Without the internet and poor cell phone service, if any, I found as many residents as I could and explained that because the lift station was full, any water in their home should not be flushed or poured down their drains. They would need to wait until our power was restored and the lift station was once again working.

At 11:00 AM, my daughter and son-in-law arrived. They helped us remove debris, mail boxes, siding,

tree limbs, etc. Without phones or texting, I realized no one was coming... we were on our own for the foreseeable future! Without power and technology, we could only communicate by word of mouth and person to person. Some people got information, and some people didn't.

After some time off to rest, I returned to the Park at 5:30 PM and stayed until sunset or about 7:30 PM. I told everyone I could, that when the power came back on, they could contact me at my daughter's house at any time and I would return to the Park to turn the water on.

7:30 the next morning, Friday, I spent about 3 hours going through the Park. I met with Rafael Ayala, the pool maintenance man. He explained that without power to the pumps, the filters are off and the pool was unsafe to use. He treated the pool and said he would be back the next morning to "shock" the pool before it turned "green" and became a major problem. I found Pat and Pedro Morales and asked them to close the pool and clubhouse while I spread the word. Meanwhile, Ruby and Jerry Ralston volunteered to make "Closed" signs for the pool. After taking a lunch and rest break, I returned at 5:00 PM and stayed until it was dark.

By this time my phone was somewhat working. A few calls came in and a few went out; with a lot of disconnects. I finally reached Jim Novak, who manages our sewer plant. He told me that all his employees and equipment were south, where the major storm damage was. My reason to call him was to ask him to pump out the lift station, so we could temporarily turn on the water to allow our residents some limited use of their toilets. Then, after a day or two, maybe he could again pump out the lift station or maybe the power would come back on.

On Saturday morning, my phone was making better connections. I called Jim Novak to make the point that we needed the lift station pumped now, but again he said that his people and equipment were tied up south of us. So, I said, "For 30 years we have employed and paid you to run our sewer plant. And you earned it. But now that we need you, you tell us you cannot help us? Maybe we chose the wrong company; maybe we need to find someone else." I

may have been bluffing.

But, 3 hours later, Jim Novak's son, David, who now runs the company, showed up at VPE. He jury-rigged a pump to the lift station and removed 2,700 gallons of sewer waste. From my calculations of our water usage, I thought that would give us about 7 days of service with careful usage. So, we turned the water back on and I went through the Park letting people know that we have water, but to use it sparingly. Before leaving, David Novak told us to check the level of the lift. He said to call him when the level reaches the top and he would return to empty it as often as needed or until the power was back on.

At the end of the day I went to bed thinking this will be a long haul. The next day a power truck with Texas plates was here. He told me he was checking power lines for a "resistance surge" which would indicate a line break or stoppage somewhere in the grid, a large area. I asked him if he finds the surge, would we get our power back. He said, "That's not my department. FPL will determine when that happens." Luckily, by 1:00 PM the power came back on.

I called Tony to ask him to come in early Monday morning to take care of the many emails and texts to send out or be answered. Informational emails and texts were sent out to owners, phone calls were made and received.

Always remember: Life isn't about waiting for the storm to pass; it's learning how to dance in the rain.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Butternut squash is a great fall vegetable. This recipe is simple

and delicious. It is special enough to add to your Thanksgiving meal.

Crispy Parmesan-Roasted Butternut Squash

(1) 1 ½ lb. butternut squash, peeled, seeded, and cut into ¾-inch pieces

2 T. olive oil

1/3 C. grated Parmesan cheese

1/4 t. dried thyme



Put squash into 15x10-inch baking pan coated with non-stick cooking spray. Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Toss to coat. Roast in preheated 425 degree oven for 15 minutes. Stir in Parmesan cheese and thyme. Roast for 5 minutes more or until squash is crispy and tender.

11 -11 11AM 1918 -The armistice between the Allies and Germany begins; the war to end all wars, WW I, is over. Red poppies are worn near the heart during the 2 weeks leading up to Nov 11. Official events in recognition of the day take place. What began on Nov 11, 1920 and 21, in London and Paris, as acts of remembrance, continues year after year in many nations around the world. The living are celebrated, the deceased are honored, and the citizens remember that freedom is not free.
