

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Since Memorial Day weekend and June are great times for camping, I am sharing one of our very favorite camping desserts. It can be done on a backyard grill (if

your grill has wide openings between grates use a sheet of aluminum foil on them) but I like to make it on a charcoal grill so it gets just a little of that char flavor. I am giving two versions because I can't decide which one is the best.

Grilled Pound Cake With Berries 1 pound cake, sliced into 1" slices. (I use SaraLee) • 2-3 C. berries (I use strawberries, blueberries and raspberries) • 6 T. butter, softened • 2 T. light brown sugar L Sugar to taste Whipped cream L

Mix together the butter and brown sugar. Brush over one side of the pound cake slices. Preheat a grill or prepare coals for a medium heat. Grill, turning once, until toasted and the sugar is carmelized and crispy. Sweeten the berries to taste and spoon over the individual slices of warm cake.

Top with whipped cream.

Grilled Pound Cake With Pineapple

- 1 pound cake, sliced into 1" slices.
- 8 pineapple slices
- 1/2 C. light brown sugar
- 4 T. butter, softened
- Whipped cream

Brush butter onto the pound cake slices. Preheat a grill or prepare coals for a medium heat. Grill until toasted and grill marks appear. Cover each slice of pineapple with brown sugar. Grill until softened, the brown sugar is melted and I juices start to run out of the pineapple. Top each I I slice of warm pound cake with a slice of pineapple I I and whipped cream.



LEAVING FOR THE SUMMER?

Recommendations prior to leaving to make sure that your home will be in good shape when you return: Empty your refrigerator, unplug it and prop open the door. Remove food from the pantry, or ensure it's in mice/insect-proof storage containers. Ask the Office to forward mail to your home address. Empty all the trash bins. Unplug power loads such as TVs, kitchen appliances, power strips and internet routers. Turn off the main water supply. Turn off the water heater. Disconnect the hoses to your washer and dryer, and unplug them. Set the thermostat to 80 degrees for AC. Turn off all the lights, close the shades/drapes. Lock all the doors and windows (leave a key with the office or caretaker for emergencies). Bring everything inside: patio furniture, flags, chair cushions, grills (disconnect the propane). Flush the toilet several times just before you leave. Pour half a cup of chlorine bleach into the toilet bowl to prevent stain-causing bacteria. Cover toilets with plastic wrap, and all sink drains with sealed plastic bags to prevent the water from evaporating in the drains which would allow sewer odors and bugs to crawl down roof vents into your house. 




